The scheme brings live professional arts to village halls and other venues, hosted by local promoters.

The Last Waltz is a poignant comedy with music, and a love story about the very last working day in a rural railway signal box. This is 2008 and Philip is the signalman about to be made redundant. But out of this sad moment comes real happiness when he rediscovers, after 20 years, his long lost teenage love, the love of his life. His defiance rings out over the hills: "They can take my signal box, but they can't take my soul".

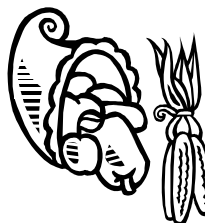


Harvest Festival at St Barbara's Church Sunday 21 September at 9.30 am

Parish Music

Now in its 14th year, Parish Music provides concerts of classical music in the five country churches of Alstone, Ashton under Hill, Beckford, Overbury and Teddington. All concerts are on Saturday evenings at 8pm, and conclude with an opportunity to meet the performers and enjoy a drink of wine or fruit juice. To cover our costs we have had to increase the admission charge this year to £10 (students and children still free).

Saturday 27 September Alstone 8pm
Music of Pubs and Palaces Broadway-based trio *Musica Leonarda* plays a lively selection of music from the taverns, concert rooms and wealthy homes of 17C and 18C Europe. The players bring together folk or 'pub' music (Carolan), the music of the court or 'palace' (Marais, Rameau, Chambonnières, Couperin), and the music of composers who moved between these two worlds and influenced them both (Corelli, Geminiani).

Saturday 18 October Beckford 8pm
The *Classic Trombone Quartet* exploits the acoustics of the lofty nave of Beckford church with an exciting programme of music ancient and modern. The quartet will play a wide variety of music from the 16th to the 20th century: arrangements of vocal music by Morales, Bach and Bruckner, canzonas for brass by Guami and Scheidt, original pieces for trombone quartet by Flor Peeters, Gareth Wood and Kazimierz Serocki, and American popular music by George Gershwin, Jerome Kern and Hoagy Carmichael.
